Alan asked members how they were going with spawning this year, Big Tony had 5 spawns on the go but only thinks one spawning group will be any good at this stage, Tony B had good numbers with his spawn and is watching closely, Brett has a Sanke spawn on the go first cull is down to 100 already, general consensus Sanke are one of the hardest breeds to achieve high quality this is a numbers game, David is going well but frogs seem to be in numbers, Alan's Kohaku culling looking for white noses and some sort of pattern and removing the toby's.

High on the agenda is sleeping sickness with baby Koi this is being reported both in WA and our colleagues in the Eastern States, a suggestion has been made to contact Dr Richmond Loh to carry out tests to find the cause of this issue. Alan brought to the table a drum filter for the members to look at, a gadget from Bunnings a defuser you connect to your garden hose that stops the hose jumping out of the bucket, Guaranteed to work!! there is also a new pump that is remote operated to increase or decrease flow pressure ideal for baby ponds and skimmers as you can turn it off by remote or reduce water flow 1 to 10. Ideal for baby ponds as you wish to up the flow.

Answer. It truly depends on your pond filter system and if it can complete the mechanical filtration and biological filtration and return good quality water back to the pond.

3) Alan final question was If I was after a SCALESS fish and only have a doitsu male and a leather female what percentage of leather skin would I get?
