Bill raised question about problems in ponds this time of year. Allan Bennett has koi with raised scales but fish is not under severe stress. The same koi displayed similar symptoms last winter and it is put down to different immune system levels in some koi. Alan Peck suggests to feed koi on good food like Medicarp available from the sales table

Miki Mo circulated photos from the Singapore show. He will give a projector presentation at the August meeting.

It was suggested to buy pumps for the show tubs. This would enable exhibitors to empty tubs without flooding the place. The committee will look into the problems of cost, storage, open power cords and sterilization and will report on the findings.



The committee will discuss the action at the next meeting. It was found that it is not easy to fit nets to tubs, storage space is in short supply and sterilization is another point. It is also not very nice for the spectators to view koi through the nets.

Allan Bennett pointed out the pros and cons of the filter and pumps used by some members. Whilst most users were happy with the filters one of Darrion's kois did break a fin on the pump.

Freya mentioned the Japanese judges comment on the quality of our koi Rod Strang said we should concentrate on breeding koi with good sumi like Ces's Bekko.

Miki Mo mentioned it not being customary of judges to comment on quality Rod Hanson found the Judge was severe on deformities.

The Judge was pleased with new concept of our show.

The concept of moving koi to judging tubs might not work with larger numbers of koi but seems to work in the UK.

Bill and Allan would like to see the Novice and Open class amalgamated into one but the categories split up into several sizes. This will need further discussion and planning.

TWO EYES ARE BETTER THAN NONE! By Allan Bennett

I was mucking around with my spare UV. I plugged it in and checked it out after just changing the tube. Ok no problem it is ready to go for the summer.

At 11.45, I woke up with a pain in my eyes. I got up and made my way to the bathroom and splashed cold water into my eyes. It was then I realized I could not see!

Panic set in and my wife called an ambulance as the pain mounted to a level that had me rolling on the floor. It was so bad I was sure I was losing my sight.

I arrived at the hospital still unable to see a thing. The medics although professional; were unable to give me anything to relieve the pain. A senior nurse met me at Emergency and asked me to open my eyes. I told her I couldn't so she called the only doctor on duty. After some initial discussion the doctor told me he would put some anesthetic in my eyes which would hurt like hell. I never felt a thing as my eyes hurt so much. He kept asking me questions about my work then asked me to go back through the things I did in the last 6 hours. I was sobbing the pain was so bad
