



Japanese Term	English Translation	How It's Used
Ai	Blue	The red scales of an "Ai Goromo" are outlined in blue
Aka	Red	An "Aka Bekko" is red with black tortoise-shell markings
Asagi	Pale Blue	An "Asagi" is a pale blue fish with a matsuba pattern and orange col- oring below the lateral line
Hi	Red	A "Hi Utsuri" is red with black stripes
Ki	Yellow Non-metallic	A "Ki Ogon" is a solid yellow koi that is not metallic.
Kohaku	Red & White	A "Kohaku" has no other colors than red and white
Ogon	Single Color	A "Platinum Ogon" is a solid satiny-white koi
Orengi	Orange	A "GinRin Orengi" is an orange fish with shiny scales
Sanshoku	Tri-Colored	A Sanke and a Showa are both "Sanshoku"
Shiro	White	A "Shiro Bekko" is white with black tortoise-shell markings
Sumi	India Ink	A fish has great "Sumi" if the black markings are deep

Japanese 101 Patterns of Koi

Japanese Term	English Translation	Description
Bekko	Tortoise Shell	The black tortoise-shell spots on a white koi make that koia " Shiro Bekko"
lnazuma	Lightning	A continuous jagged pattern that extends from the head of the koi to the tail
Koromo	Robed	A white fish with red markings that are robed by a different color scale outline
Ku- chibeni	Kuchi = Lips Beni = Red	Red coloring on the lips of the koi
Matsuba	Pine Cone	A single-colored koi with a darker color inlaid in the scales create a pine cone pattern
Shusui	Autumn Sky	A Shusui is a koi that is pale blue with a line of navy scales down its back and orange below the lateral line
Tancho	Tancho Crane	The red mark on the head of a fish (can be circular, triangular or heart-shaped) resem- bles the red mark on a tancho crane
Utsuri	Reflection	Black striped fish with white, red or yellow markings. Most often characterized by de- sired black lightening mark across the face

Creating the Varieties of Koi

It has always helped me to remember the varieties of koi by breaking them down to the simplest variety first then adding colors, markings and scale-types. The koi becomes a new variety with every edition.



Start With a Single Colored Regular-

Scaled Koi

Some of the most beautiful koi in the world are one solid color. Referred to as **Ogons**, these magnificent koi are most frequently found in satiny-white (**Platinum Ogon**), orange (**Orengi**), red (**Hi Ogon**) and yellow (**Ki Ogon**).









Steps to Creating a Sanke

Begin with a solid white koi — a **Platinum Ogon**.

Add black spots. The koi is now a **Shiro Bekko** (white tortoise-shell). The perfect Shiro Bekko has no sumi (black) on his head and his head is solid white with the least amount of flesh tone as possible. Add red in spots all over the Shiro Bekko and you end up with a **Sanke** (tri-colored) - a white koi with red and black "spots". A Sanke can have no black on his face.



Steps to Creating a Showa

Begin with a solid black koi, a Karasugoi (crow koi).

Add white marbeling. The koi is now a **Shiro Utsuri** (white reflection). The white of the Shiro Utsuri should be snow white and the sumi (black) as black as India ink.

Add red all over the body and wha-lah! You have a **Showa** (*tri-colored*) - a black koi with red and white markings. A sign of a good Showa is a distinct lightning mark across the face.



Steps to Creating a Kohaku

Start with a **Platinum Ogon**.

Add red all over the body — no black this time at all. We now have a **Kohaku** (*red and white*). No koi collection should be without one. Its red should appear as if it were painted on like nail polish with no blurred borders against the white. Kohakus are further classified by the number of steps (red spots) on the koi. If the Kohaku has a single, continuous, jagged pattern that looks similar to lightning that extends from the face to the tail it is classified as an **Inazuma Kohaku**. A **Nidan Kohaku** has 2 steps. A **Sandan Kohaku** has 3 steps (such as the one pictured) and a **Yondan Kohaku** has 4 steps.
