

Well, we have reached our target of obtaining a trailer for the club. The committee would like to express our appreciation to all the members who helped in making this happen. It will now be a lot easier to transport club equipment to any club events.

The Public Koi Auction 26th August 2007

Our first public Koi auction at Cannington Greyhound Complex got on the way at 7.00 AM by opening of the gates. The first job was setting up the tanks Tim and Allan picked up the previous week from our container. The layout was in sequence of members booking tanks and favoured accessibility for vehicles and trailers whilst making it easy for the auctioneers and the bidders. The available taps on site nearly delivered enough water to fill the 19 auction tanks and the one holding tank in time for the benching. The Wall girls, Nancy and Kylie, trucked 3000 litres in and I brought 600 litres. This saved us ordering a water tanker at a cost of about \$ 300.00. The much needed oxygen kits were made available by the Wall's and the Passey's.

Fourteen sellers ordered 19 bins and entered lots of Koi over 25 cm and a lot of bagged fixed price lots. Sorry for making the auction entry rules up late in the game. Allowed were 20 Koi to be auctioned per member and fixed priced bag lots. Due to the effort of the committee the auction got on the way in time. The number of visitors was limited by the atrocious weather but bidding during the auction was fine and I hope most members were happy with their sales. The auctioneers, baggers and administrative persons did an outstanding job and the auction finished in time. Thanks to all organisers and helpers.

To make this public auction a successful annual event it will need fine tuning.

The booking of tanks had to be confirmed by telephoning myself by August 10th. This was stated in the June newsletter onwards and at every subsequent meeting. Booking of one or two tanks was for free. Out of 14 members two rang other committee members and five entered late, one cancelled his tank at the meeting before the auction, one did not cancel his tank and a further one wanted to order a tank the Saturday morning before the auction (entry was refused) and the last one rang a committee member for a tank on the auction morning. Rumor has it that although he got refused he entered his Koi in an acquaintance's tank.
