KSWA Northern Branch News

Welcome in July to new members Mark, Rick and Sam. We hope you guys learn stacks and enjoy your koi journey with us. Apologies from Fred Sharp (recently elected secretary) who is unwell. We're thinking of you Fred and hope you get better soon.

The recent KSWA AGM resulted in the election a new committee. A position is still vacant for treasurer though so we'd love you hear from you if think you can help. News from the committee is that the club is in a great position financially but we do have some significant spends coming up such as new show tanks for the annual show. Also we're not getting as much income from the club auctions as before due to fussier buyers © and therefore lower sales. The committee has also been dealing with the potential treatment of koi by the Dept of Fisheries.

Discussion

If you're thinking of making a carbon filter as described by Martin at the May meeting, Peter has some surplus activated carbon at \$7.70 per kg – much cheaper than you'll buy it at the pet shops.

Peter also discussed his ideas about improving club auctions which Allan will take to the committee. Also suggested was getting more product reps along to the NB meetings such as organisations that sell pumps etc.

That got your attention! © Richard gave a presentation about the nitrogen cycle, why it's important for koi keepers and how to manage it. It covered topics such ammonia, nitrites, nitrates and the effects of pond age, pH and water temperature. Reducing the impact of nitrogen-based toxins on your fish was also discussed.

You gotta...Know when to hold 'em

Allan gave an amazing presentation showing, in time lapse fashion, how some of his favourite Showa babies have developed from fry-size to 50cm+ size over the past few years.

It was startling to see how they've changed, something Showas are well known for, but actually seeing the same fish at different ages was very educational. Allan provided some great insight on knowing what keep and what not to.

NITROGEN CYCLE

At the July Northern Branch Meeting, Richard gave a talk on the nitrogen cycle—a critical part of looking after our pond water quality, often misunderstood by koi hobbyists.

Here are some of the main points from the talk.

In the pond environment, the nitrogen cycle is

Fish waste (poo & respiration waste), uneaten food, rotting leaves & plants

 Ψ

These things rot and break down into **AMMONIA** (very toxic)



Bacteria (called nitrosomonas) convert AMMONIA to **NITRITE** (very toxic)



Bacteria (called nitrobacter) convert NITRITE to **NITRATE** (less toxic)

How to avoid having ammonia and nitrite in your pond:

- Filtration, filtration, filtration! If your filters are adequate, they will immediately convert ammonia to nitrite, then nitrite to nitrate.
- Design your pond properly so sludge waste doesn't build up anywhere & rot

To make it easier for your filter:

• don't overfeed, don't overstock your pond, don't add dozens of big fish in one day (do it gradually to give the bacteria time to catch up).

If your filters are working properly, you will have **0 AMMONIA and 0 NITRITE**. NITRATE will build up slowly, and this should be removed with water changes (plant filters will also help).

New filters will take a few months (or even up to a year) to properly establish their bacteria population. Monitor water quality in this time, and be extra careful not to overfeed or overstock.

Cold water slows down the bacteria activity, so your filters convert ammonia and nitrite less effectively over Winter. This is one reason it is important to cut down on feeding over Winter.

Why do you want to avoid ammonia and nitrite? Ammonia kills fish. Nitrite is also highly toxic as it reduces the oxygen carrying ability of blood, and can turn blood brown (brown blood disease).

Ammonia toxicity doubles from 20 degrees to 30 degrees. Ammonia toxicity also depends on your pH, and we don't know what a fatal level is for koi, but for other fish it can be as low as 1.3 parts per million (ppm). Aim for 0, and if it isn't 0, you may need to look at fixing your pond design or filtration systems.

Salt can help prevent the fish absorbing nitrite, so it can be a good "insurance policy" in case something goes wrong with your filters.

These toxins are INVISIBLE. Clear water can be full of them and you wouldn't know unless you are testing. Ammonia, nitrite and nitrate test kits are available at all good koi retail outlets. Murky or green water may look bad to us, but does not necessarily = toxic.

We are "water keepers" more than "koi keepers". Take care of the water, and the water will make sure your koi are healthy. Healthy koi = happy koi keeper.
