

Rules of thumb

Use potassium permanganate if:

- · Fish are showing signs of hypoxia (low oxygen).
- There is no algae in the pond.
- Algae in the pond is not photosynthesising (i.e. at night or if the weather is
- . There is considerable amount of organic matter that would compete with fish for the oxygen.

Do not use potassium permanganate:

- During day time if there is algae in the pond.
- In alkaline conditions (a solid precipitate of manganese dioxide (MnO₂) can form on and damage the gills).
- · Repeatedly as it can cause gill "burns".

RE: Potassium permanganate's effects on dissolved oxygen.

A question was raised at the Central Branch KSWA meeting about the effects on dissolved oxygen by the addition of potassium permanganate to the pond. Does it increase oxygen, or does it decrease it? It is a rather simple question with a rather convoluted answer because at certain times, it can increase the oxygen, but in other cases, it can decrease it. The reasoning behind this can be explained in the paragraphs that follow.

Potassium permanganate (KMnO₄), is a chemical oxidizing agent that will react with any organic matter in a pond including algae, bacteria, fish, particulate and dissolved organic, and organic bottom sediments. It has been used in fish ponds to treat common fish pathogens such as gill parasites and external bacterial and fungal infections.

There is confusion about whether or not it adds or removes oxygen from the water. It does in fact, release oxygen as it breaks down given by the following equation:

During such reactions the manganate ion (MnO_4) loses two oxygen atoms and is reduced to insoluble manganese dioxide (MnO_2) . The 'lost' oxygen atoms react with organic matter, reducing the chemical oxygen demand and improving water quality and clarity.

So, the theory behind adding potassium permanganate to your pond during times of power failure is to help reduce the consumption of oxygen by the decaying organic matter and to supply free oxygen to the water.

In some ponds, algae play a significant role in oxygenating the water through the process of photosynthesis during daylight hours. And so, the reason why it is sometimes thought that potassium permanganate "removes" oxygen from the water is due to their algicidal effect – the daylight rates of oxygen gain drops dramatically.

For this reason, the consideration of the above factors/variables would govern the use of potassium permanganate to oxygenate the water.
